



LEVEL 3 CERTIFICATE IN COACHING DODGEBALL

Course Information

Duration: 44 hours

Format:

- Blended Learning: 2 hours online pre-course learning, 6 hours face to face open course for individuals and small groups bookable on the [British Dodgeball website](#), 30 hours experiential learning to be undertaken at weekly sessions, 6 hours presentation of learning

Assessment Framework

Assessment Criteria

The British Dodgeball Level 3 Certificate in Coaching Dodgeball is a course which can be passed or failed. It is assessed on the following criteria during the Day 2 learning presentation in addition to practical observation of coaching, questioning and reflective discussions.

Learning Presentation

Participants will have 20 minutes of time allocated for them to present on Day 2. This is their main opportunity to evidence their understanding of the assessment criteria above. The presentation will be conducted virtually and candidates are encouraged to share slides, photographs and videos in order to better illustrate their learning journey. A further 10 minutes of time will be allocated for Q&A between the presenter, tutor & other candidates. Tutors will assess each candidate's presentation relating to each of the above criteria.

Assessment Framework

Passing the Course

Once a candidate has demonstrated adequate understanding of the assessment criteria through the above, they have successfully completed the Level 3 Certificate in Coaching Dodgeball. Candidates that do not satisfy all assessment criteria will not pass and must retake the course in the future.

Conditional Pass

Tutors may decide that although certain candidates did not satisfy all criteria, they were very close to showing competencies in all areas. At their discretion, tutors may award a pass on the condition that the candidate undertakes activities in order to develop an area of weakness.

Further activities may include one or more of the following:

1. Shadow a qualified Level 3 coach for a number of sessions.
2. Write a 500-word reflection on specific aspects of their coaching (e.g. communicating effectively with others) and how you may apply these. The specific aspects should be linked to the criteria which the candidate has failed to satisfy during the course.

Reflections will be assessed at the tutor's discretion. A deadline of 90 days will be applied to any tasks which candidates are asked to undertake, and the tutor will provide an email address at which the candidate must send the work. Upon receipt of the task, the tutor will have a maximum of 28 days to assess and award a pass or fail decision.

Appeals

Candidates who are not awarded with a pass may appeal the decision. To do so, they must contact hello@britishdodgeball.com within 7 days of the fail decision with the following information:

- Course details
- Any reasons given for not awarding a passing grade
- Any relevant evidence such as a copy of further tasks completed should be attached
- Email contact details for a response

The decision will be taken by three British Dodgeball staff members. They will use information given within the complaint, and a statement from the tutor or other participants if relevant, to come to a decision to uphold the appeal or the original decision. A decision will be made within 28 days of the appeal being submitted.

Further Information

Certification

An E-certificate will be issued upon notification of a candidate passing the course. This will be emailed out once the participant has passed the course providing any outstanding invoices have been paid. Any participants waiting for a certificate that have completed the steps outlined above should wait for up to 10 working days before emailing hello@britishdodgeball.com with any enquiries.

Anyone that has not completed the Level 2 Award in Coaching Dodgeball will not be eligible to receive their Level 3 Certificate in Coaching Dodgeball until this has been completed.

Pre-Course Learning

This will be accessible via the online course portal as soon as an individual purchases their place through the website. If a place is booked via email, then an enrolment email will be sent out to the participant; occasionally these emails go to spam folders so it is advised that participants check there before contacting British Dodgeball. The information contained within the pre-course learning must be covered by the participant before the course date; this should take no longer than 2 hours.
