Assessment Framework

Assessment Criteria

The British Dodgeball Level 2 Certificate in Coaching Dodgeball is a course which can be passed or failed. It is assessed on the following criteria through practical observation of coaching, questioning and reflective discussions:

1. Able to demonstrate a basic standard of officiating
2. Able to coach technical skills
3. Able to teach tactical understanding
4. Able to lead inclusive sessions
5. Able to lead safe sessions
6. Can adopt specific approaches to work with others effectively

Practical Assessment

Participants will have the opportunity to deliver three times during the course. Tutors will assess each candidate's performance relating to each of the above criteria throughout the course.

Passing the Course

Once a candidate has demonstrated adequate understanding of the assessment criteria through both of the above, they have successfully completed the Level 2 Certificate in Coaching Dodgeball. Candidates that do not satisfy all assessment criteria will not pass and must retake the course in the future.

Conditional Pass

Tutors may decide that although certain candidates did not satisfy all criteria, they were very close to showing competencies in all areas. At their discretion, tutors may award a pass on the condition that the candidate undertakes activities in order to develop an area of weakness.

Further activities may include one or more of the following:

1. Shadow a qualified Level 2 coach for a number of sessions.
2. Write a 300-word reflection on specific aspects of their coaching (e.g. working with groups) and how you may apply these. The specific aspects should be linked to the criteria which the candidate has failed to satisfy during the course.
3. Complete the Level 2 Certificate in Coaching Dodgeball Written Task.

Reflections will be assessed at the tutor's discretion whilst the assignment will be marked by a tutor formally adhering to the mark scheme. A deadline of 28 days will be applied to any tasks which candidates are asked to undertake, and the tutor will provide an email address at which the candidate must send the work. Upon receipt of the task, the tutor will have a maximum of 28 days to assess and award a pass or fail decision.

Further Information

Appeals

Candidates who are not awarded with a pass may appeal the decision. To do so, they must contact hello@britishdodgeball.com within 7 days of the fail decision with the following information:

- Course details
- Any reasons given for not awarding a passing grade
- Any relevant evidence such as a copy of further tasks completed should be attached
- Email contact details for a response

The decision will be taken by three British Dodgeball staff members. They will use information given within the complaint, and a statement from the tutor or other participants if relevant, to come to a decision to uphold the appeal or the original decision. A decision will be made within 28 days of the appeal being submitted.

Certification

An E-certificate will be issued upon notification of a candidate passing the course. This will be emailed out once the participant has passed the course providing any outstanding invoices have been paid. Any participants waiting for a certificate that have completed the steps outlined above should wait for up to 10 working days before emailing hello@britishdodgeball.com with any enquiries.

Anyone that has not completed the Level 1 Award in Coaching Dodgeball will not be eligible to receive their Level 2 Certificate in Coaching Dodgeball until this has been completed.

Closed Course Group Bookings

The minimum number for closed courses is 10 participants. Participants can be replaced as long as new participants have completed the Level 1 assignment prior to the Level 2 course date. Should the number of participants attending the Level 2 course date drop, the course may still go ahead but organisations will still be charged for those on the register expected to attend except in exceptional circumstances. In the case of those that have booked the Level 1 & Level 2 Coach Education package, organisations will be charged the full price for any participants that complete the Level 1 but then do not attend the Level 2 course date.

Further Information

Pre-Course Learning

This will be sent via email approximately five working days before the course date (providing register information has been supplied in time regarding closed courses). The information contained within must be covered by the participant before the course date; this should take no longer than 30 minutes.
